

MR. EDGAR SANTOYO-CASTELAZO, Ph.D.

Since November 2013, Dr. Santoyo-Castelazo works at the Ministry of Energy (SENER). Previous to his current position, Dr. Santoyo-Castelazo served as Director of Technological Innovation at the Ministry of Energy in Mexico.

Currently, he holds the position of General Director of Research and Technological and Talent Development at the same Ministry of Energy, where he is directly in charge of conducting the design, implementation and monitoring of Public Policies in Research and in Technological and Talent Development for the energy sector in Mexico.

He represents the Ministry of Energy at the National Evaluation Commission for the Hydrocarbons and Energy Sustainability Funds, for decision-making on the R&D portfolio investments.

From 2014 to date he teaches at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM). From 2011-2013, he worked as a lecturer and a research associate at the University of Manchester, in UK. His main research lines are: Sustainable Development in Industry, Life Cycle Assessment, Energy Planning and Multi-Criteria Decision Analysis, including teaching activities and talent training at the UG and PG levels.

He completed his PhD at University of Manchester, an MSc (with honors) and a Bachelor degree in Chemical Engineering at the Autonomous University of Morelos State (UAEM), Mexico.
